

Assessment is a key part of your learning. It allows you to develop and to demonstrate the knowledge, skills and understanding that gaining a university degree is all about. Underpinning the value of the qualification you are working towards is the assumption that is **your work** and **your sustained effort** is reflected in the grades **you are awarded**.

Resist any temptation or offer to complete your work by others. This can include individuals, groups and commercial organisations. Do not do anything that could call into question the academic integrity of your work.

You are reminded that when submitting your assignments, you are asked if the work submitted is your own. By agreeing you are **specifically stating** that the **work is your own**

If you are struggling with aspects of your assignment or in meeting the deadline, we advise that you contact, your tutor/ module leader in order to discuss how they can support you to successfully complete your work.
